High-visibility clothing – Helmets – Safety shoes

- When working in harbour areas / active work areas
 - High-visibility clothing (vest, jacket), IST-EN20471:2013 Class-2
 - Safety shoes, IST-EN 20345:2011
 - Safety helmet, IST-EN 397:2012
- Guests within the working area
 - Minimise all unnecessary traffic of persons within the work area
 - High-visibility clothing and helmet









Other personal protection equipment

- Appropriate personal protection equipment (PPE)
 - Hearing protection
 - Safety glasses
 - Work gloves
 - Dust masks
 - Shields / protective clothing for cutting or welding work,
 - etc.
- Markings at the relevant working locations



















Life vests

- When working at sea
- Work on the reception of vessels
- When working by/on wharf (reference =<2 m)
- Use crotch straps / follow instructions









Setting work area limits

- Assess risk
 - Risk assessment
 - Vehicle traffic
 - Public pedestrian traffic
 - Other risk
 - Does the work pose risks?

Think first, then act...







Working at a height

- Instead of a ladder, we use:
 - Work platform or basket
 - Steps
- Fall protection equipment
 - Work using boom lift, remember fall protection
 - Rescue plans in place
- Remember risk assessment, evaluation of conditions
 - Use the appropriate personal protection equipment














Vehicles / industrial machinery

- Appropriate certification available
- Be a role model in traffic
- Use warning lights in closed harbour areas
- Reverse into parking slot
 - Use reversing camera when available
- Ensure that equipment is secured properly
- Do not leave keys in machinery or vehicles
- Check equipment and return in the same condition as you would like to receive it
- Mandatory inspection completed
- Avoid running in neutral





Risk assessment of projects

- Risk assessments need not be complicated
- Use simple methods
 - Dialogue / review the work in your mind before beginning
 - WHAT ARE THE POTENTIAL RISKS?
 - What can I do to minimise risk or consequences?
 - Actions?
- Think first, then act...

Conduct

- Protection of the sea and its ecosystem



Hazardous materials

- Minimise use
 - Select environmentally friendlier if possible
- Follow instructions / safety data sheets
 - Storage
 - Use
 - Disposal
- Emergency equipment and response plan





Fuel and oils

- Preventive maintenance and monitoring
 - Monitor leaks
- Carefulness and common sense
- Response plan for pollution accidents
 - Appropriate response equipment
- Waste oils
 - Ensure correct treatment

Waste

- Maximise utilisation / minimise waste
- Follow the appropriate sorting rules
 - At operating units
 - In projects
- Hazardous materials / electrical equipment waste
 - Ensure correct handling






